

ABOUT THE AWARDS



For the second year, the awards were custom designed and produced by Bob and Karen Madden of Rock and A Soft Place Studios. Each award is created with two of the most basic materials known to humans: metal and stone. Mild steel is used which is bent, curled and twisted into a graceful sculpture. The simplicity of each design invites the admirer to bring to mind

their own imagery. The final piece is powder coated with a colorful and durable finish. The base is locally sourced metamorphic rock several types being granite, gneiss and schist to name a few and all of which can include minerals, quartz, feldspar and other inclusions which give the rock it's unique characteristics. SPECIAL CITATION: The Hudson Valley Philharmonic String Competition Committee

The Hudson Valley Philharmonic String Competition has been a highlight of the Hudson Valley scene for over 50 years! Begun under Hudson Valley Philharmonic Maestro Claude Monteux in the 1960s, it attracts outstanding violin, viola and cello students from Juilliard, New England Conservatory, Curtiss and many other prominent music conservatories. Winners have gone on to become professional performers and teachers. The competition is held on the campus of Vassar College each March, and the winner plays with the Philharmonic at the Bardavon Opera House the next season. Generous donors fund the prizes and operating costs, and a dedicated volunteer committee coordinates all logistics and planning. The committee is Paul Stoddard, Chair, Susan Avery, Laura Coons, Reva Cowan, Linda Kleinhenz, Susan Lesser, Tom Ostrofsky, Judith Stoddard, Barbara Van Itallie, Ron VonAllman, Miriam Zimet-Aaron, and Nancy Severns. THINK DIFFERENTLY IN THE ARTS: i2Evolve

i2Evolve art studio in Red Hook, New York was created in 2018 by Kimberly Popolizio, a former New York City public school art teacher, who had the privilege of working with children facing various crises in some of the most underserved communities. i2Evolve works with children and adults of all abilities offering a diverse range of services and consulting options. Their reach extends to local agencies servicing children in foster, residential care, children in day treatment programs as well as our local school district's special education, flex classes, local community children, and private sessions for adults with varying abilities. This past year they brought curriculum to the neurodiverse student population of grades K-12 in the Red Hook Central School District. They succeeded at having every student represented at the district wide art show. The excitement was building this year as they hosted an open house for all abilities welcoming over 15 young adults from varying adult programs in Dutchess County. i2Evolve offers a nurturing, non-clinical environment where children and adults disconnect from stress and express their inner thoughts through imagination and creativity. Children and adults are equipped with valuable tools to self-regulate, enhance self-awareness, experience empowerment, and foster personal growth.

ARTIVIST: Paola Bari

Paola learned to love ceramics as a young girl in Italy and traveled all over the world to learn different techniques. She worked for IBM in Milano until 1996, when she was invited to cross the Atlantic. After ending her career at IBM in Poughkeepsie, NY, Paola devoted herself to porcelain painting. Her work in porcelain are quite whimsical, featuring stretching frogs, cats, and ornately decorated game fowl. She is very involved in the local art community helping with local events and organizing makers markets. Paola is currently curating Gallery 40 with Mary Ann Glass providing a space to showcase art from local artists. She is also active in conservation where she volunteers for the Cheetah Conservation Fund, located in Namibia, Africa, in which her focus has been mainly focusing on education and fundraising.

YOUTH WITH EXCEPTIONAL PROMISE IN THE ARTS: Rowan Parsaca

Rowan Parsaca is a recent graduate of Beacon High School. She has participated in the arts in Beacon her entire life. She is part of DIA:Beacon's teen program and regularly works with local artists Ron English, Hayden Wayne, and most recently, as Eponine in the Beacon Players production of Les Miserables. She loves performing, art, and creating community with those around her, and hopes to continue doing so as she studies voice and music therapy in the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam.

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES: Dutchess County Historical Society for Clowes Exhibit

The Dutchess County Historical Society celebrates all aspects of local history. It is particularly exciting to celebrate the work of artists, like LaGrange's 19th century Caroline Morgan Clowes or Pougkeepsie's 20th century Eunice Hatfield Smith. Anyone looking at their work is reminded how universal and timeless artistic expression is. We are transported to locations we are familiar with, but that are revealed to us in the dress of how they looked a century or two ago. We reach the public by either locating an exhibition where there's a good deal of day to day activity already, or by bringing traveling exhibitions to more remote parts of the county. In either case, our work is the same: to preserve, interpret and present to the public, the wonderful history of the county.

ARTS IN EDUCATION: Jim Osborn

James Osborn was born and raised in Dutchess County and is an Arlington High School graduate. He majored in Political *Science and Music* at The State University at Albany and received his Master of Music degree from The State University at Stony Brook. For the last forty years Jim has been on the faculty at Vassar College where he directs the college's Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combos and Wind Ensemble and teaches trumpet. Jim also teaches at Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, Pit Orchestra and Pep Band. He previously taught instrumental music at Marist College, Dutchess Community College and nine area Catholic Schools. Jim also enjoys a very active performing career as a trumpeter and vocalist and has performed with The Hudson Valley Philharmonic, The Hudson Valley Brass Consortium, Tony Bennett, Bobby Vinton and his own seven piece band, The Jim Osborn Band. Jim lives in the Town of LaGrange with his wife Janice and their three dogs and tries to play a little golf in his spare time.

BUSINESS: Albert Shahinian Fine Art

Albert Shahinian Fine Art celebrates its 25th year as one of the region's premier fine art venues. Besides its formal exhibition program, the gallery has presented musical performances, spoken word series, and artist colloquia. Co-managed with Albert's spouse, Joanna Hess, the gallery has occupied several locations since 1998, including those in Poughkeepsie, Hudson, New Paltz and currently, Rhinebeck. Shahinian founded and ran Poughkeepsie Art Museum (2004-2005) as a separate exhibition-based venue. He also has organized and installed exhibits for The Desmond Fish Library; The Museum of the Hudson Highlands; Columbia-Greene Community College; Yale Institute of Sacred Music; and Spitz Gallery, London, England. A former educator and music conductor, Albert worked previously for Hudson River Sloop Clearwater and Pauline Oliveros Foundation, and served six years on the Barrett Art Center Board. Since 2001 he has worked in the Preparator's department at the Hessel Museum/Center for Curatorial Studies at Bard College.

INDIVIDUAL ARTIST: Jodé Millman

Jodé Millman is a life-long resident of Poughkeepsie, which serves as the setting for her popular crime fiction novels. The first three installments of her true-crime inspired "Queen City Crimes" series, *THE EMPTY KAYAK, HOOKER AVENUE, and THE MIDNIGHT CALL*, have won numerous awards including: The Independent Press, Independent Publishers, American Fiction, and Clue Awards. For decades, Jodé has practiced law in New York, and she is also a reviewer for Booktrib.com, and the host/producer of *The Backstage with the Bardavon* podcast. Merging her passion for the arts and law, she created The Writer's Law School, an educational program designed to inform writers and artists about their legal rights, and which she has presented to arts organizations, libraries, and colleges. Her philanthropic interests have guided her to lead her family's foundation, The Millman Harris Romano Foundation, and to serve as a trustee for the Dyson Foundation.

VOLUNTEER: Randy Caruso

"Countless lands to discover, countless seeds to bloom - and again the day slips away" I'm optimistic to a fault: projects, art, code, and building stuff - there's not much separation anymore. I survive as a web developer by day, theater tech by night. I've always taken things apart to find the secrets, looked where I was told not to, seen past the grids and rules to find unexplored territory. Still surprised how much there is. I'm lucky enough to be married to Jill Losee, have a daughter (Ali Caruso), be surrounded by too many pets, and have a home I can carve to be everything we need. All this in a town (Beacon) we can walk to and find our coffees and snacks with little effort, life is pretty good. The Seeger Theater is where I spend a lot of time, an amazing stage embedded in a high school - so we have a support system like no other. As a community we have some great access to talent and resources that you might imagine right outside of NYC. We have few boundaries, it's an amazing experience to build a show there.

ARTS ORGANIZATION: The KuBe Art Center

The KuBe Art Center, founded by Ethan Cohen and Zhu Ceng in 2011, serves the burgeoning arts community in the Hudson Valley by providing space for artists and local businesses in an unconventional setting. The repurposed Beacon High School has over 60 commercial workspaces. It also houses art organizations as well as Ethan Cohen Gallery, whose programming has provided a platform for community engagement through exchanges between local and international arts & culture. KuBe is home to the Cohen Library, one of the largest archives of contemporary Chinese and African art in North America. The name KuBe is an acronym for the German word 'Kunsthalle', meaning art hall, and the town's name, 'Beacon'. This Fall, Ethan Cohen and Ron English will produce an exhibition entitled "Back To School", which will Kube's largest exhibition to date. Next year, the KuBe will begin an ongoing collaboration with world-renowned artist Yigal Ozeri and the Eileen S. Kaminsky Family Foundation to present his works to the public.
